Connecting Youth and Families to the Natural World in the Nebraska Panhandle

Bird Conservancy Receives Grant from Nebraska Environmental Trust

Scottsbluff, NE – Bird Conservancy of the Rockies will receive \$42,526 from the Nebraska Environmental Trust (NET) to fund the "Connecting Youth and Families to the Natural World in the Nebraska Panhandle" project. The Trust is funded by proceeds from the Nebraska Lottery and has awarded more than \$349 million to more than 2,400 conservation projects across the state of Nebraska since 1994. The Trust works to preserve, protect and restore our natural resources for future generations.

April 8, 2021 the Trust Board announced the award at their quarterly meeting in Lincoln, NE. This is the first year of the award with a potential for second year funding totaling \$38,925. The project is one of the 113 projects receiving \$18,350,515 in grant awards from lottery proceeds in 2021. Of these, 42 are newly funded grants and 71 are carry-over projects.

Bird Conservancy of the Rockies' mission is to conserve birds and their habitats through science, education and land stewardship. In Nebraska, we fulfill this mission through conservation education programs in partnership with Nebraska Game and Parks Commission (NGPC). Support from NGPC and NET enables us to increase environmental literacy and promote stewardship, engaging over 1,500 Nebraska residents each year. Bird banding stations and BioBlitz's combine science, exploration and education to reach school students, community members and local resource experts, and take place in two Biologically Unique Landscapes. Family Nature Club allows local families to immerse and connect with nature around them in the Scottsbluff area.

Programming from this project fulfills a need for environmental education programs and services in western Nebraska by empowering communities to care for local natural resources, and inspiring the next generation of Nebraska conservation stewards. Through partnerships, collaboration and support from local partners: The Trust, NGPC and Chadron State College, all of Bird Conservancy's education programs and services in the Nebraska Panhandle are provided at no cost to the participant. Together we are empowering communities to learn, appreciate and conserve their local natural resources through the lens of bird conservation.
